**Ringfenced more than £225k in community funds for local areas**

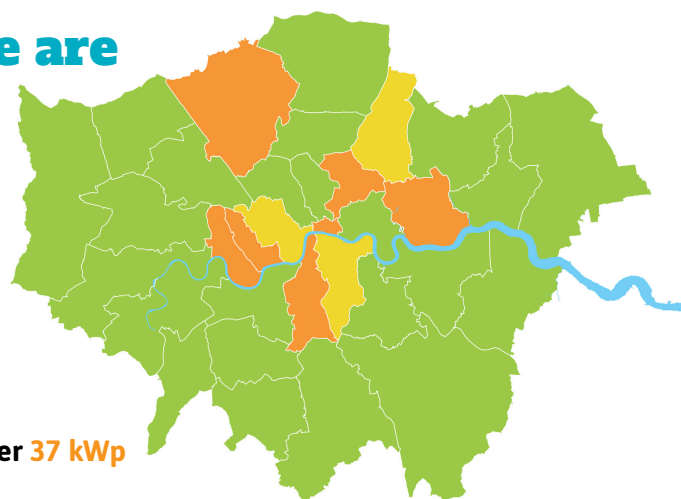

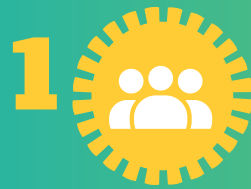

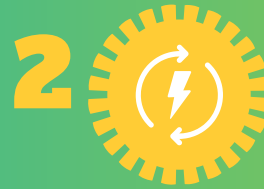
# Energising London's communities

With some 900 people involved as local investors, co-op members and volunteers, around 60 people having received mentoring in governance and management, and activities that reach hundreds of children and young people each year, we're linking engaged citizens and energy equity. We are showing how community energy projects and energy efficiency can reduce bills, bring in investment income and result in carbon reductions that will help meet London's zero carbon climate target.

## In brief: How our co-op model works



**1** Members of the community come together to form a Community Benefit Society (co-op)



**2** The co-op installs local, renewable energy assets – which are funded through community share offers



**3** The assets generate income that provides for interest payments to member shareholders & administration costs



Any remaining profit goes into a Community Fund which co-op members use for the community's benefit



## Our Toolkit

### Rooftop Solar & Retrofit

We support local communities to build solar installations that are owned by and provide direct benefits to them, including cost savings, investment opportunities and employment. We also support communities to reduce energy demand through retrofit of buildings and homes.



### Energy Affordability

We are leading the evolution of the UK energy system by developing new models for providing locally generated electricity at affordable prices. We also fight fuel poverty by offering training and energy efficiency support.



### Education & Training

We give people the skills and information they need to build our low-carbon future. This includes delivering education and training workshops for young people, volunteers and residents.

### Community Empowerment

We work alongside local residents to establish community energy projects that embed principles of community ownership, control and benefit. Residents gain the skills and knowledge they need to take local action and participate in the energy transition.
